MEMBER'S PROTECTION REPORT 2023

NER has complied with NSW member protection guidelines. We continued to support online Working With Children (WWC) certification validation within the NSW government portal (<https://wwccheck.cyp.nsw.gov.au/Employers/Login>) for all NER adults undertaking coaching and manager positions during 2023.

The MPIO is the first point of contact for any member or child protection enquiries or complaints. As such, they can provide information and options including policies and complaint resolution options.

The MPIO handled two formal complaints in 2023 both being treated with complete confidentiality.

The MPIO is not expected to mediate or investigate complaints. As such, with the full agreement of the involved parties, suitable club representatives handled the matters and reported back to the NERSC Executive Committee. Both matters were closed with recommendations adopted.

Another member approached the MPIO to informally discuss a matter but elected for there to be no further action.



During the process of handling these matters it was recognised that it would be appropriate for the Club to ensure that there is a clear separation of responsibilities between the Executive Committee and the Section Committees. As such, going forward, the persons elected to the Executive positions of President, Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer will not have roles on any of the Section Committees.

While the Club did make some progress towards adopting a Code of Conduct there is still work to be done to align with the child safe standards and the associated programs provided by the Office of the Children's Guardian.

The inbound Management Committee for 2024 will need to support the new MPIO with progress on these as the moratorium period for transition will soon be over.

FOOTBALL REPORT 2023

2023 was a year of change for football at the club with an almost entirely new committee working hard to start a new era of football at the club. Building on the work done by past committees, our focus was multi-faceted, with several new initiatives implemented throughout the season.

We started the year with a 2000-flyer letterbox drop, inviting existing and new players to a 'Welcome to Rangers' Day. This was a huge success with over 400 people attending a day filled with fun activities for the kids and a chance for a community to come together and discuss the year ahead. We also devised a new Grading Policy that saw 8 official graders oversee our grading process to ensure we gave every player a chance to shine and show us their skill level. The results from this initiative spoke for themselves with 27 teams from U12 and up playing in the finals.

This year we also introduced several specialist coaching clinics for our players including attacking and defensive sessions and goal keeping training. These additional training sessions were very well attended with over 60 players attending each session.

The FMC also created a Code of Conduct that was pushed out to all football members with the over-arching message of 'Respect over Results'. This was a key message we wanted all NER players to adopt. Respect for the referee, the opposition, the spectators, and their own team. It was great to tour the grounds, both locally and through the wider community and see the new NER Sponsorship banners with this message emblazoned across the banner, along with Le Specs, our major sponsor.

We reintroduced the BBQ at Ron Payne each Saturday morning and at NEO for quite a few games. The parents of our Minis did a great job feeding the masses at Ron Payne while our SL men and WPL women did likewise at North Epping Oval.

With the Women's World Cup on in Australia, and through the tireless work of some of our committee members, we also saw our players given several opportunities to be part of the World Cup, culminating with 8 lucky players being able to walk out for the Women's semifinal match in Sydney. The success of the Matildas also mirrored a lot of the success we enjoyed with our female players. With a record number joining the minis, and our WU14 1s and our WAA6 teams making the finals and our WPL just missing out on a finals berth. Just as thrilling was to see our WPL team embrace the girl's mini's teams, turning up to help coach them and having some of them walk out on the field with them at the start of a game against Mac Dragons. A real highlight of the year.

2023 saw 3 teams finish top of the table and 6 teams play in a Grand Final. This is a tremendous effort and a testament to our dedicated coaches and players. 4 teams won their GF including the Mixed U12/5's, WU14/1's, AA5's and the AA12's. Our SL team had a terrific season finishing just out of the top 4.

On behalf of the FMC, I would like to extend my sincere appreciation to every member who contributed to the Rangers this year. Whether you were a parent on the sidelines, one of our countless volunteers, a player, or a referee, you have done the club proud and I thank you for your service.

Finally, I would like to say thank you to the members of the management committee who, from a standing start, have worked tirelessly throughout the year to ensure the club is in a stronger position than what it was when we first took the reins.
