NETBALL REPORT 2025

Overview

The 2025 season was another strong and successful year for North Epping Rangers Netball. We were fortunate to have fewer rained-out games at Meadowbank; however, our NetSetGo teams at Brush Farm experienced significant disruptions due to weather, with games played on grass courts.

Importantly, this was our final year of having NetSetGo and Under 10s competing at a separate location. From 2026, all age groups will come together at the new West Ryde Multi-Sports Facility—an exciting step forward for the club.

This season we fielded 19 teams, including one Walking Netball team and two NetSetGo teams, with just under 200 registered players proudly representing North Epping Rangers.

We had an outstanding finals series this year, with eight teams qualifying for the finals—a fantastic achievement and a testament to the hard work of our players, coaches, and supporters.

One of our teams progressed all the way to the Grand Final, narrowly missing out on the ultimate prize. Although they fell just short, their determination, teamwork, and club spirit were exceptional and made us immensely proud.

There was no Spring Competition this year due to the redevelopment of the Meadowbank courts, which are being repurposed for additional football fields as ERNA prepares to relocate to the new West Ryde facility ahead of the 2026 season.

NetSetGo

This year we introduced free registration for new players under the age of ten who had not previously played netball with NER. This initiative supported growth in our junior program.

Club Marquee

Our club marquee continued to be a welcoming hub at Meadowbank each Saturday. It remains an essential part of our club culture—teams meet there before games to gather, chat, and walk to their courts together. After matches, many players return to share results, celebrations, and stories, reinforcing the strong club spirit we are so proud of.

A huge thank-you to Catherine Murphy from The Agency for her ongoing sponsorship of the marquee.

Umpiring

All new NER umpires received a NER umpiring polo, also proudly sponsored by Catherine Murphy from The Agency.

The NER Team White umpiring squad included 30 umpires, making us one of the largest contributors to the ERNA Winter Competition. Our umpires officiated for NER and 17 additional clubs, covering 338 games, totalling approximately 500 hours of umpiring across 12 rounds.

Introduction

The 2025 season was one of growth, resilience, and achievement for the North Epping Rangers. Club Governance & Administration

Player Registrations & Retention

- Achieved a 68% player retention rate from Season 2024 – ranking in the top 4 across the North West Sydney Football Association.
- Secured 93% of last season's registration numbers, a strong comparative result against the broader association.
- Recorded an increase in female player registrations, reflecting our commitment to inclusivity and growth.
- Introduced a female cut jersey and reintroduced front-of-jersey sponsorship logos for female squads, enhancing both comfort and visibility.

Community Engagement & Support

- Received outstanding support at the Ron Payne BBQ, reinforcing the club's community spirit.
- Continued the tradition of annual exhibition matches with the Army, which remain a highlight of our calendar.
- Hosted the Female Masters competition at North Epping Oval, providing a more suitable venue for participants.
- Launched the Boot Bank initiative, enabling families to swap football boots and save hundreds of dollars.

Player Development & Pathways

- Established the North Epping Rangers Football Academy, already delivering noticeable improvements in player abilities.
- Launched the Women's Premier League Development Squad, strengthening female pathways.
- Delivered Football School Holiday Camps, attracting over 70 children and fostering grassroots development.
- Introduced the Young Football Coaches Pathway, with five junior coaches completing the Foundation of Football Course.

Team Achievements

- Welcomed James Walker back to the club as the new Super League Coach.
- Our Men's Super League squad distinguished itself as the only squad with both Reserves and First Teams reaching the Finals.
- The U18/1 Men's team proudly reached the State Champion of Champions competition.

Facilities

- The refurbished Ron Payne Oval was available for use this season and will be further improved for next year, enhancing the playing experience for all teams.



Recognition & Awards

- Culminating an exceptional year, the North Epping Rangers was selected by Football Australia as Metropolitan Club of the Year for Season 2025.
- Recognition for the incredible focus on Female Football through initiatives noted above.
- The announcement was made at the Matildas v New Zealand match in Gosford, where over 115 junior Rangers players participated in the event, showcasing our club on the national stage.

Season 2025 demonstrated the strength, resilience, and ambition of the North Epping Rangers Football Section. From governance to grassroots development, from community initiatives to elite competition, our club football family continues to grow in stature and impact.
